

Feelings Graph

This activity is a great way to get children thinking about how the main character feels at different points in the story. It is great for developing inference and deduction.

Pupils work in pairs/groups to plot a character's emotional journey at key points on the story.

The graph can then be used to retell the story or for other children to consider which character it describes.

They can also use a different colour to plot the feelings of another character. This is a great way into thinking about viewpoint and different characters' perspectives.

In Key Stage 2 if you are studying a longer novel, you can create a feelings graph for each chapter with page references, quotes and annotations linked to the text to track different characters' feelings.
